About Liberty High School

Liberty High School, with enrollment of nearly 3000 students grades 9 through 12, is a comprehensive high school accredited by the Pennsylvania Department of Education. The current high school was built and dedicated in 1922. Recently renovated and rededicated in 2009, it boasts 570, 000 square feet of learning space on approximately 22 acres. The campus consists of five buildings: Klein Classroom Center, Commons Building, Lab Center, Student Activities Center and the Memorial Gymnasium. There are 129 classrooms, equipped with laptop carts, projectors, and updated Wifi capabilities.

Special Programs

Liberty has many special programs that offer students a wide variety of experiences. Our school operates within a Career Pathways model designed to assist students with choosing courses and high school experiences that fit their career interests. Liberty provides students with dual enrollment opportunities at local colleges and on-line learning forums, to suit our changing academic world. Students have the opportunity to take STEM related courses and even enter into the nationally certified engineering and bio-med program called Project Lead The Way. In addition to a vast array Advanced Placement and Honors courses, our students may take classes at the Bethlehem Area Vocational-Technical School. Comprehensive careers programs are available such as: Early Childhood Development, ESOL school-to-work at St. Lukes' Hospital, and the 9th Grade Center for transition to High School.

Liberty High School strives to create a positive learning community, dedicated to a culture of excellence, where all relationships are valued. All members of the Liberty family have a responsibility to uphold the spirit of accountability through open communication, consistency, mutual respect, and school wide safety. Through collaboration, our school will provide opportunity for growth and develop independent thinkers for our 21st century global society.

Tradition and the Community

Bethlehem is a city in Lehigh and Northampton counties in the Lehigh Valley region of eastern Pennsylvania. The Lehigh Valley, a region of 731 square miles, is home to more than 800,000 people, making it Pennsylvania's third-largest metropolitan area. Bethlehem has a population of approximately 72,000 making it the sixth largest city in Pennsylvania, after Philadelphia, Pittsburgh, Allentown, Erie, and Reading.

The city of Bethlehem is home to two institutes of higher education. Lehigh University, located on the city's South Side, and Moravian College, located in the center city area. Other major institutions of higher learning in the Lehigh Valley include DeSales University, Cedar Crest College, Lafayette College, Muhlenberg College, Penn State Lehigh Valley Campus and Northampton Community College. The Lehigh Valley maintains a strong commitment to educational excellence.

The Bethlehem Area School District covers the City of Bethlehem, the Boroughs of Fountain Hill and Freemansburg, and Bethlehem Township and Hanover Township. The district operates two high schools, four middle schools, and sixteen elementary schools as well as other educational institutions.

Activities & Athletics

All co-curricular activities are an integral part of the school curriculum. The school's athletic teams compete in the Eastern Pennsylvania Conference; sports include baseball, basketball, cheerleading, cross country, field hockey, football, golf, rifle, soccer, softball, swimming, tennis, track and field, volleyball and wrestling. Our teams have been very successful in participating in State play-off action and many other competitions. In December 2008, the Liberty High School varsity football team won the Pennsylvania 4A State Championship! Our athletic facilities include an auxiliary gym, a state of the art natatorium, three weight training rooms, our Memorial Gym (seats 3150 people), four tennis courts, a baseball field, a softball field, practice fields, and the BASD Stadium.

The Liberty High School Grenadier Band is a world-renowned marching band. The Grenadier Band has performed abroad numerous times and has also played at the Tournament of Roses Parade, the Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade, Pearl Harbor, Disney World, Disneyland, many professional sporting events, and a multitude of other prestigious activities. Currently, the band has over 280 members.

A sampling of other clubs and organizations include Choraliers, FBLA, DECA, Key Club, Latino Leadership, Liberty Theatre, SADD, Stage Crew, Student Government, NHS, Scholastic Scrimmage, Debate Club, STEM Club, Strategy Club, Newspaper, Yearbook and Young Writer.

Liberty offers demanding Advanced Placement, bonors, college preparatory, career preparatory and vocational programs. Graduation requirements are 26.0 credits and completion of a minimum of 60 bours of community service.

Grading & Class Rank

Grading procedures provide for student grading on a quarterly basis with midyear and final exams. Grades range from A+ to C- (70) average designated as the passing grade. Honors Courses and Advanced Placement courses as noted on transcript receive one additional grade point unit (A = 5.0, B = 4.0, etc.). While weighting is used to determine rank in class, the final recorded grade on the transcript does not reflect the assignment of the extra weight.

Class Rank is computed at the end of each semester for all students with an official class rank at the end of each school year. Exempt from rank is Community Service. All students are ranked together by grade.


