Books you read for Barnes and Noble or the Bethlehem Area Public Library, for example, will count for our program, too! What helps make reading entertaining is when students are given the freedom to choose books that appeal to their unique interests!

Your child should record his or her summer reading on the attached Summer Reading Log form. Students who participate in the Summer Reading Around the World Challenge should return their reading log form to their homeroom teacher upon returning to school. Those students who have read **1,000 minutes or more** will receive a **Proud Pound**.
