



❁ Inclement Weather Procedures for Students & Parents in 2022-2023 ❁

Described below will be the BASD's weather-related practices in the 2022-2023 school year.

- Weather-related *late starts* and *early dismissals* will occur as usual.
- The first four (4) weather-related closures will be treated as traditional “*Snow Days*” that are already built into to the 2022-2023 school calendar.
- Students will have no assignment responsibilities on the *Snow Days*.
- Should weather conditions require more than four *Snow Days* during the school year, the Superintendent will determine if weather conditions require a *Snow Day* that will be made up later in the school year, or if students will have an *Online Learning Day*.
 - *Online Learning Days* will be used when weather reports allow teachers sufficient time to prepare/post online learning activities.
 - On *Online Learning Days* teachers will post online course assignments within one hour after the normal start of the school day. There will be no synchronous instruction on *Online Learning Days*; students will complete assignments independently.
 - An *Online Learning Day* will count as an instructional day for purposes of state attendance requirements.
 - On *Online Learning Days*, student attendance will be determined by his/her completion of the online assignments (contact Principal for further details).
 - Teachers will be available on *Online Learning Days* to support students during the hours of a regular school day by checking e-mail frequently and/or using district-supported devices to communicate with students and parents.



In the case of weather-related or emergency circumstances that prevent students' safe travel or participation in a normal school day, the BASD Superintendent will announce one of the three (3) options:

1. A Snow Day Closure (no school/no assignments of any type)
2. An Online Assignment Day (completely asynchronous assignments)
3. A Remote Learning Day (a blend of synchronous and asynchronous instruction)

Described below are the *Elementary Online Assignment Day* and the *Elementary Remote Learning Day*

Elementary Online Assignment Day

The completely asynchronous *Online Assignment Day Schedule* will be used on days when school will be in session, but students will not physically report to school because of unsafe travel or emergency conditions. The *Online Assignment Day Schedule* will be used when there was not adequate time for teachers to prepare for a more blended *Remote Learning Day*. The *Online Assignment Day* will count as an official day of school.

Here are some tips and tricks to make your *Online Assignment Day* a success!

- Connect as many families as possible now to your communications app (ClassDojo, Remind, etc.) so you can communicate in cases of emergency.
- Practice how to get access to the online assignments with your class
- Remember, we are **not trying to replicate a regular school day**. We are doing the essentials to keep them engaged and progressing. 😊

The completely asynchronous *Elementary Online Assignment Day Schedule* is as follows:

9:00 AM - 10:30 AM	Students complete asynchronous Literacy assignment(s) posted in Google Classroom
10:30 AM - 3:30 PM	Students complete asynchronous Math assignment(s) posted in Google Classroom Don't forget to eat lunch! Students complete asynchronous Related Arts assignment in Google Classroom
1:30 PM - 2:30 PM	Teacher Office Hours (Teachers are available on Google Meet to address student and/or parent questions)
2:30 PM to 3:30 PM	Students complete the asynchronous <i>Online Assignment Day</i> assignments Teachers connect with families through their Communication Apps with any additional information for the following day

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Elementary Remote Learning Day

The *Elementary Remote Learning Day Schedule* will be used on days when school will be in session, but students will not physically report to school because of unsafe travel or emergency conditions. The *Elementary Remote Learning Day* blends synchronous and asynchronous instruction. The day will count as an official day of school.

Here are some tips and tricks to make your remote learning day a success!

- Connect as many families as possible now to your communications app (ClassDojo, Remind, etc.) so you can communicate in cases of emergency.
- Create your online links early so you can communicate them to your families
- Practice how to get on your online Google Meet session with your class
- Connect your students to Google Classroom, ConnectED, First in Math, EnVision, etc.
- Remember, we are **not trying to replicate a regular school day**. We are doing the essentials to keep them engaged and progressing. ☺

10:00 AM – 10:30 AM	Synchronous Literacy Session – Small Group with teacher On Google Meet Or Independent Work
10:30 AM – 3:30 PM	<p style="text-align: center;">Students complete asynchronous Math assignments (check-in with your Classroom Teacher between 1:30 PM and 2:30 PM , if needed);</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Students complete asynchronous Related Arts assignment (check-in with your Related Arts teacher, if needed *see Related Arts Teachers Office Hour Schedule below);</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Don't forget to eat lunch!</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Special Ed, Reading, ESL Teachers hold small group meetings as per IEPs</p>
