FAQ Frequently Asked Questions

- Q Does my child need to dress up?
- A Not for this dance! (Only for the semi-formal in January). Casual clothes are appropriate. Students must still comply with the BASD Code of Conduct.
- Q Does my child need a date?
- A Absolutely not! Middle school dances are designed for dancing & hanging out.
- Q Does my child need money?
- A Only if they would like to purchase snacks from the Snack Stand. Students often like to purchase food and drink during the dance.
- Q Where is the dance?
- A Dances are always held in the cafeteria.
- Q Are there chaperones?
- A Yes, we have many faculty chaperones who assist with each dance. In addition, Mr. Mayes, Mr. Wagner, & Officer Conley are always present. Students are always supervised by adults.
- Q My child has another activity to go to at 7pm. Can I pick them up early?
- A No. Once a child is in the dance, they must stay until 8pm. If they need to leave early, they should not attend. This is because it is extremely difficult to make sure we have everyone!
- Q Where do I meet my child after the dance?
- A A good plan is to park your car and meet your child at the front of the school after the dance. Students may walk home. Everyone must cross safely at the crosswalks. It will be dark, so plan ahead!

Please review the rules & procedures below:

1. Student attendance at Nitschmann Middle School dances is a privilege for <u>Nitschmann Middle School students only</u> and are subject to all rules and regulations outlined in the Bethlehem Area School District Student Rights and Responsibilities Policy and Student Code of Conduct. Students may be removed from the dance at any time for violations of the Code of Conduct by administration

- 2. Dance and student supervision will begin at **6:00 pm**. and end at **8:00 pm**. No students will be permitted to enter school prior to 5:45 pm. All students must enter and depart Nitschmann Middle School through the Main Front Doors. Doors close @ 6:15 pm and no students will be admitted after 6:30 pm. Students attending the dance will not be permitted to depart the dance until the conclusion of the dance at 8:00 pm. Students will be required to leave outerwear (coats, etc.) near the front entrance during the dance. Students are responsible for their items.
- 3. <u>All students attending the dance must have a ticket. Tickets may be purchased ahead of time or at the door.</u> All students must attend school on Friday for the full day to attend the dance.
- 4. Students must comply with the BASD dress code in order to be admitted to the dance. No hats are permitted.
- 5. Students will be able to purchase snacks at the dance. No outside food or drink will be permitted.

studying vocabulary terms, and in social studies we continue to work on map skills. Please make sure your child has a scissor, colored pencils, a glue stick, and a calculator. Tissues for the classroom are always appreciated.

Students will be using rulers, various glassware, and balances to demonstrate proficiency with the metric system and lab equipment. ELA- vocabulary quiz on Tuesday, Two Voices Poetry readings on Wednesday; Reading- Literacy History papers are due Monday. Geography - students are continuing to work on map skills and current events. Team - We will be having a friendly tug of war competition with team Kutztown on Tuesday during team time.

Team East Stroudsburg (8th) (Twitter @NMSTeamESU) Monday is the 230th Anniversary of our nation's Constitution being presented to We the People for ratification. We will be diving into some amendment scenarios. Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday will focus on the Real World Problem projects. Students will be working on these projects for the next 8 months: an in-depth study of a problem they have a passion about. Reading classes will build background knowledge on Abraham Lincoln and will begin the novel Chasing Lincoln's Killer. The 1st book report should be handed in by Wednesday in order to be on schedule to complete three for the quarter. Science: Next week we will enter Unit 1 Section 2 of our studies. This includes measuring matter. We will cover mass, volume, density, and we will hold a Metric Olympics. Those labs will take place Tuesday and Wednesday and a quiz will be Friday to pair with current events in science. All students will be taking their first quiz in math on Monday. Then we will move into Lesson 1-2. We are also finishing the SMI benchmark testing. ELA: It's hard to believe that

we've finished three weeks of school already! On Monday, we will have our adjective assessment. We will then continue on with verbs, leading us into participles. We are continuing with our Writer's Notebook weeklyh entries. Please make sure you have a MINIMUM of one page for History of the Name and 9/11. This week will be lists. Also, a focus on good paragraph writing will occur this week.

Team Northampton (8th) (Twitter @TeamSpartanNMS) Next week our Spartans will be investigating measurement with the metric system and participating in the Metric Olympics. Iconic Image Project is due in History next week. Adaption to environment and how environment shapes cultures will be the key points as we study early Native American culture. We will also formulate educated opinions on pressing issues today like drilling in the arctic, casinos, mascots and protection of the environment that affect our Native American roots. Grade 8 Math will be working of the laws of exponents. Algebra 1 students will be solving linear equations. Next week in ELA, we will finish discussing our historical context presentations. We will then begin reading our novel, NightJohn. We will also start our next word crime unit, which is the uses of the noun. Students in all Literacy classes will be starting our unit on nonfiction with a focus on the Civil War and the assassination of Abraham Lincoln. All students should have their own novel signed out from the library on Friday and are responsible to bring the novel with them each day to class. We will also begin to focus on literary elements and figurative language within the text as well as using text-based evidence to prove responses. September's Celebration theme is Neon Storm - start rounding up anything that is bright, glitters, or sparkles!
