Meeting called to order at 6:30 P.M. by Erin Coughlin

Welcome by Erin Coughlin, introduction of executive committee.

Rita Clark presented 2016/2017 NPG budget. (a hard copy of budget is attached) During the discussion of the budget several NPG initiatives and old business were addressed. Decisions are bolded.

Recent September 2017 **Book fair** profits are pending. Last year's box tops were under budget. Reasons may include only one campaign for the collection of box tops. There may be a collection of box tops located somewhere. Erin to look into locating any box tops from last year. Discussion of prizes, is it necessary to have a ice-cream party, this is an expanse that cuts into profits. Concerns about children with allergies not being able to participate.

Agreed: prizes for the top three students only, no class prize.

Box tops still needs a chairperson.

**Holiday Extravaganza**: The NPG earned 1065.12 from the 2016 Holiday Extravaganza. The Extravaganza is a vender fair held at Nitchmann in November. Venders purchase tables and sell products. In addition to the money for a table each vender donates an item for the basket raffle.

**Therese Gyauch and Tiffany (LNU) have volunteered to chair this year's extravaganza**. Sasha Graver was the chairperson last year. NPG to reach out to Ms. Graver.

**Shoparoo**: This an app that allows individuals to photograph their shopping receipt and send to Shoparoo. Shoparoo will send Nitschmann a check based on amount collected. The shopper does not need to live in PA so friends and family far away may also participate. Karen (LNU) will provide a short blurb so Mr. Mayes can send out the information in the Sunday newsletter.

A discussion commenced concerning the NPG becoming a more formal organization. **Scott Walker has volunteered to establish a 503**. There is a 275.00 registration fee for a 503.

Kimberly Marcantonio and Therese Gyauch will write the bylaws.

Several names for the group were discussed. No clear front runner. Discussion to continue.

Mr. Mayes discussed the NPG becoming the group responsible for the concession stand at the school dances. Currently the cheerleaders run the concession stand at all the dances. If the NPG were to be responsible the income stream from the concession stands could better serve the needs of the school, field trips, specifically the college field trips each team makes every year. There are 6 dances, NPG can ask for donations of food/water. Parents group would need to staff the concession stand at the dances. All individuals who volunteer must have their clearances. Community service volunteers from the high school could also be used.

There would be no charge for the movie but the NPG could sell popcorn, soda, glow sticks, etc. NPG will **organize an spring outdoor movie night**. Incoming 5<sup>th</sup> graders will be invited.

Budget review continued: last year NPG provded 510.00 dollars for PSSA gifts. **NPG will continue to provide PSSA gifts for the upcoming school year.** 

**No monies were needed for American Education week**. Volunteers are needed at the "welcome table". American Education week is scheduled for Tuesday October 10, Wednesday October 11, and Thursday October 12, 2017.

Budget review continued: Author Day, last year NPG budgeted \$2,000 for author day and the actual amount was 1864.35. Amount depends on author chosen. **NPG to continue to fund Author day**.

2016-2017 NPG budget operated at a deficit. There is an existing balance of 4034.00 in the account. There was a discussion concerning having a balance that exceeds more than one year's worth of operating expanses. **The 2016-2017 budget was accepted by the NPG**.

NPG agreed to fund the 6<sup>th</sup> grade college field trips this year. Team Moravian will not need a bus, they walk. Team Lehigh and Lafayette will need 2 busses per team.

**PAC representatives**: Four individuals volunteered to be the Nitschmann representatives for the BASD Parent Advisory Council. Kimberly Marcantonio, Therese Gyauch, Amy Wuertele and Peter McLeod will be the PAC reps.

Next PAC meeting is scheduled for September 28, 2017 at Nitschmann. PAC representatives should arrive early and be available to show attendees to meeting location.

Souper Luncheon: held during teacher appreciation week. This year's luncheon will be on Tuesday May 8, 2018. According to Mr. Mayes the teachers always look forward to this day, it's a highlight of the

year. NPG assists in soliciting soup donations and help with the set-up/clean-up. **Therese and McKenzie** will assist in decorating for this event.

NPG will provide a 500.00 for donation for the carnival held each spring.

NMS future participation in a Halloween parade was discussed. Maybe Nitschmann could have a float? Ride behind the band? NPG will reach out to Ms. Loupus.

Mr. Mayes would like to host a volunteer breakfast in the spring to thank all the school volunteers.

Ms. Hood has asked if the NPG could assist in covering the cost of a NYT magazine subscription for her class. Mr. Mayes will provide the necessary monies for the instructional material needed. Kimberly Marcantonio will let Ms. Hood know.
