While the low water level of the Lehigh River shortened the canoe portion of the trip, the students were still able to learn how to paddle a canoe and briefly and safely paddled across the river. **Math** - Students in Period 2 and 5 will be taking their first Unit Test on Monday October 2. Students in periods 7 and 8 are working on Radicals and Irrational Numbers and Students in Period 1 are learning more about working with fractions. **Science**- This coming week there will be a test on the structure of the metric system (base units, prefixes, abbreviations, & values) and metric conversions on Tuesday, October 3rd. Afterwards, we will be discussing the different types of measurement, starting with

using a ruler and meter stick to measure length and using a triple beam balance to measure mass. **English** - Vocabulary Quiz #4 on Tuesday - This week begins Unit 2 in English ,The Author Study. The students will begin a unit on author, H.H. Munro. They will learn about his life, writing style, and begin reading several of his popular short stories. Terms that will be discussed this week - (irony, genre, foreshadowing, and theme).

Students have been informed as to which day they will be going and were expected to write the date in their planner.
