SCIENCE: formal lab report project submission by SUNDAY (10/22) on google classroom!!! Reading - book reviews are due this Wednesday, 10/25. Notebooks are being checked this coming week too. Geography - students will continue evaluating the Five Themes of Geography and will develop their own unique place. Students will need to bring colored pencils to class this week. There will be a notebook check by the end of the week.

Team East Stroudsburg (8th) (Twitter <u>@NMSTeamESU</u>) History class will focus on the events that led to Columbus' journey to the new world. Reading classes will continue reading Chasing Lincoln's Killer/Manhunt. Maps should be worked on for 5-10 minutes each night. All book reports due by November 30. In math class all students will be spending this next week preparing for their first Unit Exam. This will be the last major grade for the quarter. Study sessions will be held in class and after school on most days. Science: Next week there will be a quiz on atomic structure and states of matter. Students will be doing periodic table labs and another Business Centered project. We will have a Kahoot game on Monday to start them off.

Team Northampton (8th) (Twitter @TeamSpartanNMS) Next week in Science, we will be continuing our Intro to Atoms. There will be a quiz on Tuesday followed by exploring the Periodic Table more closely. Early exploration will be the topic on hand in History class, taking us from the Spanish Conquistadors to a great debate about Columbus. This week in ELA, we will be developing our characters for our historical fiction narrative account. Periods 1, 3, and 5 have their research for their project due this week. Period 8 has their acrostic poem due Wednesday,

Oct. 25. Please ask to see your child's research and converse about their ideas for the account. Algebra 1 students will be working with Rate of Change, Slope, and Write and Graph Linear Equations (sections 2-1 to 2-4). 8th Grade Math students (periods 3,5,7) will be reviewing solving linear equations and taking notes on Proportional Relationships and Analyzing Linear Equations. 8th Grade Math (period 1) will be Solving Linear Equations. All of Wallach's classes have the artifact project due Monday. This includes: the artifact, the written portion (typed), and the rubric. All of these pieces are due on Monday. Also, students should be ready to present their project on Monday with note cards and a rehearsed presentation. Please reference the detailed rubric students received over two weeks ago. In addition, students in Wallach's periods 1,5, and 7 will have a test on chapters 1-6 on *Chasing Lincoln's Killer*. We will review what students need to know on Tuesday. Students are encouraged to go back and re-read the chapters if they have forgotten any content as well as study from their notes.
