We will specifically be focusing on how to organize and analyze data and draw a conclusion. We will also be preparing and reviewing for a unit test on the Scientific Method during the week of Dec. 11th. **English** - All students will continue their study of noun uses with the focus being on objective and possessive case.

Parents and students - please continue to check e-school/parent portal to keep up to date on your grades. The mid quarter is quickly approaching and progress reports will be generated next week! Science - we will be using our microscopes this week to do our live cell comparison lab. We will also be learning about the macromolecules in cells via a stations exploration. This exploration ties into Mrs. Getz's unit on the Holocaust. Students will have the opportunity for extra credit (science/ELA) next weekend by participating in a calorie restriction and completing a reflection about it. Information will be sent home with students who request the extra credit. We encourage parents to try and do it with them. As their team of teachers, we participate each year to remember those who suffered. Reading - The students are creating a text dependent analysis while studying the criminal justice system. We are using evidence from a situation in the book to support the sentencing of the character. Students seem to be enjoying our study of <u>The Outsiders</u>. Geography - Students will participate in a class Geography Bee this week in order to qualify for the school wide Geography Bee. We are continuing our study of the physical geography of North America. Math - Eighth period has a quiz on Tuesday. ELA there is a vocabulary guiz on Tuesday. Final copy of Holocaust journals are due on Wednesday.

Team East Stroudsburg (8th) (Twitter @NMSTeamESU) History classes will study the growth of Jamestown through the scope of tobacco; plantation economics, slavery, and the 14th amendment. Oral history is due December 18th, please plan accordingly. Reading classes will be starting the novel Soldier X. Notebooks should contain daily Talking to the Text notes as well as a chapter theme analysis. The notebook grade this quarter will be a full 100 point grade so daily maintenance and hard work is critical to earning a good grade this quarter. All students are encouraged to work on the basic skills iXL practice at home when they have time. Algebra 1 will be testing on linear equations. Math 8 will be learning more about solving equations. Please make sure you have completed all written questions for NIGHTJOHN. You should be bringing in any materials that you may need for the projects. Science: In science we will be reviewing everything taught in chemistry to this point. Then we will learn how atoms bond with one-another. There will be a series of labs and notes to be taken during this week.

Team Northampton (8th) (Twitter @TeamSpartanNMS) Next week in ELA, Periods 1, 3, and 5 have the final drafts of their historical fiction narrative accounts due on Wednesday, Dec. 6 at 4 pm. These periods will also have a narrative writing test on Friday, Dec. 8. Periods 7 and 8 have the rough draft of their historical fiction narrative accounts due on Monday, Dec. 4. We will spend the week revising them with a due date to be announced for the following week. All

sections will be focusing on Relations and Functions. Periods 1,3,5,7 have their research guided notes due Monday on relations and Functions - this can be done through Google Docs/Slides or hard copy. Period 8 is starting Chapter 3. Chemical Bonding is the topic of instruction next week in Science. Early colonization at Roanoke and Jamestown will be the study of inquiry next week. We will be watching an episode of Expedition Unknown on the "hard data/facts" collected to figure out the 400 year mystery! Our December Celebration THEME is where your "ugliest" sweater and/or a combination of red/green/festive wear!

Pennsylvania CareerZone allows students to explore the world of work through a variety of activities. Pennsylvania CareerZone is designed so students can progress at their own pace. Students will want to ask their parents questions as they explore potential occupations, colleges, and lifestyles and this guide is to help parents and guardians understand how Pennsylvania CareerZone works so they can help their student through the career exploration process.

When students begin using Pennsylvania CareerZone they have the option to create an account to store their activities.
