Keep it up! **Science (Mr. Pearson)** - This coming week students will finish learning how to convert between units in the metric system. They will have a quiz on converting between units in the metric system and the structure of the metric system on Thursday, September 27th. A study guide for the quiz will be going home on Monday.

@NMSTeamPennState) (Instagram pennstatenms) <u>ELA- Period 1, 2, 5 & 8</u> - Two Voices Poetry presentations on Wednesday (9/26), vocabulary quiz on Tuesday, (9/25), we will continue our Holocaust Unit. <u>Period 7</u> - Get to Know R. J. Palacio due 9/25, we will continue our unit on the novel <u>Wonder</u>. <u>SCIENCE</u>-Students will be assessed in length, volume and mass measurements next week with a lab practical. <u>MATH</u> - All classes are continuing to work on a unit on rational numbers. Periods 1,2,5 and 7 have a quiz Thursday on sections 1-1 - 1-5. Period 8 will be nearing the end of the unit and should expect a test early next week. Expect students to have homework in math almost every day, all year. Most students are demonstrating responsibility in this area, but others are earning zeros. <u>Reading-</u> First book reviews are due September 28. The eighth period will read Wonder and discuss characters and setting. We will be reading <u>The Boy in the Striped Pajamas</u> in period 1,2,5 and study visualization and imagery. <u>Social Studies</u>- We will have the Unit 1 test Oct 1st.

Team East Stroudsburg (8th) (Twitter <u>@NMSTeamESU</u>) History classes will review the impact of Jamestown on the social, political and cultural development of the United States. We will also begin investigating how the New England colonies developed a different type of colonies, starting with Massachusetts. Reading classes will begin the short story, <u>Lincoln: A Photobiography</u> to build background knowledge before starting our 1st novel, <u>Chasing Lincoln's Killer</u> at the end of the week. Science: Students will be recapping all of the labs we did this week. We will look at the vocabulary again in review. We will be linking energy to physical and chemical changes. We have one more lab and then we have a quiz on Friday on the metric system, and physical/chemical changes. There will be a Schoology pre-assessment that prepares them for the quiz on Friday. This will be available for students from Monday through Friday. In ELA Students are finishing up their articles on 9/11 creating engaging leads to hook the reader's attention. They are also learning about the root word -cogn. For grammar, students will be working on the difference between active voice and passive voice as well as recognizing (and creating) subjects within a sentence.





In math classes, students are learning how to work with square roots (estimating and simplifying). Algebra students are starting to understand linear equations. All students have a quiz this Monday or Tuesday coming up

In ELA this week, we will finish reading "The Speckled Band" and will begin our casebook study project. In our word crimes unit, we will continue to explore the uses of the noun. Students can expect a quiz around the middle of the week. In Reading, we are continuing our nonfiction unit and will be going to the library next week to sign out our novels. We will continue to work on citing text-based evidence and using our critical thinking skills. Students will have a notebook quiz on Thursday and should come to see me before or after school if needed. Please check your Schoology class for updates, announcements, assignments and any handouts used in class. In Algebra 1, students will be Solving Inequalities, and Absolute Value Equations and Inequalities. In Grade 8 Math, students will work with Scientific Notation. Students will continue to use both the IXL and Math XL programs. Please continue to check Schoology for all assignments, assessments and due dates. In Science, we will be beginning a unit on an Introduction to Matter specifically focused on Elements Compounds and Mixtures.
