There will be a vocabulary quiz on the Lesson 4 words on Monday, October 1. Additionally, the first Unit Test on Punctuation will be given on Tuesday, October 2. All students were given a fairly extensive study guide for this test. There are a number of sample questions included with the study guide. Reading (Mrs. Gomez) - First period will have a test on chapters 1-3 of The Giver on Wednesday, October 3. Second period will have a test on chapters 1-3 of The Outsiders on Wednesday, October 3 and a test on the characters on Thursday, October 4. Fifth & seventh periods will have a test on pages 1-72 of the novel Notes From the Midnight Driver on Wednesday, October 3. Eighth period is still working on the novel The Lightning Thief, where they are researching and learning about Greek mythology topics that are tied into the novel. Finally, just a reminder that students should be reading 30-40 minutes a night in order to be caught up on their reading. Their next novel overview form (#2) is due on Wednesday, October 24th.

Math (Mrs. Van Woert) - Periods 2 & 5 will have a test on Integers & Rational Numbers on Friday, October 5th. Science (Mr. Pearson) - We will continue with our metric system unit this coming week. Students will be learning how to measure length, mass, and volume.

Mid-quarter grades are being finalized this week. **ELA-** *Period 1, 2, 5 & 8* - GIST due Monday 10pm, Kinder Questions due Tuesday 10pm, possessive noun quiz on Thursday *Period 7* - Poetry reading presentations Tuesday, possessive noun quiz on Thursday, we will continue our unit on the novel **Wonder**. **SCIENCE**-On Monday, we will be testing the effect of red cabbage juice on chemicals. The students will be learning how to design experiments by controlling variables. At the end of the week, we will be going to "science court" to reinforce the concepts of collecting and interpreting data. **MATH** - All classes are continuing to work on a unit on rational numbers. Period 8 is taking their unit test on Wednesday. Periods 1,2,5 and 7 have a quiz Thursday





on all 4 integer operations and should expect a unit test next week. Expect students to have homework in math almost every day, all year. Most students are demonstrating responsibility in this area, but others are earning zeros. **Reading-** Tuesday-Period 1,2,5,7 have a quiz on chapters 1-6. Period 8 has a quiz on Wed. **Social Studies-** We will have the Unit 1 test Oct 1st.

Team East Stroudsburg (8th) (Twitter <u>@NMSTeamESU</u>) Math 8 students are learning how to simplify and estimate square roots. Algebra 1 students are learning about inequalities and how to solve and graph them. Reading classes will begin Chasing Lincoln's Killer and Manhunt. All book reports are due October 29. History classes will be studying why Thanksgiving should be this week instead of in November. The origins of religious freedom in America will be discussed with an eye toward the 1st Amendment.

In Reading, we are continuing our nonfiction unit with Manhunt and Chasing Lincoln's Killer. Students all have their own copy of the novels and are expected to bring them to class every day. We will continue to work on citing text-based evidence and using our critical thinking skills. Please check your Schoology class for updates, announcements, assignments and any handouts used in class. In Algebra 1, students will be Solving Inequalities, and Absolute Value Equations and Inequalities. In Grade 8 Math, students will work with Scientific Notation. Students will continue to use both the IXL and Math XL programs. Please continue to check Schoology for all assignments, assessments and due dates. In Science, we will be beginning a unit on an Introduction to Matter specifically focused on Elements Compounds and Mixtures.
