Academic Team Updates

Thank you to all the parents who came to our school for BASD Education Week. We hope you enjoyed observing the children in their classes. On Tuesday, October 18, Team Lafayette will be visiting Lafayette College for the day. Please have your child bring in \$5 for lunch. Students may start bringing the \$5 to homeroom teachers on Monday.

Reading (Mrs. Gomez) - Students in first period should begin to prepare for a test on chapters 4-9 of The Giver later in the week; possibly on Thursday. Also, students have a map drawing due on Monday. They were to take the information given to them about the setting and create their own map of the community. Second period students just finished up reading chapter 6 of The Outsiders and will have a comprehension test on chapter 4-6 on Tuesday. Fifth and seventh period students should begin to prepare for a test on pages 74-124 in the novel Notes From the Midnight Driver on Wednesday. Students in eighth period have a map drawing due on Monday. They were to take the information given to them about the setting and create their own map of Camp Half Blood as we continue to read The Lightning Thief. Also, just a quick reminder that the student's novel overview form is due on Wednesday, October 24. Students now have the option to complete the assignment directly on Schoology.

English (Mr. Falteich) - Students will have a unit test on Thursday - A vocabulary review test on all words from lessons 1-5 (60 words). We will continue our author study unit (H.H. Munro - 7 stories). "The Interlopers" and "Gabriel Ernest" will be read and we will discuss the following literary terms: allusion, theme, irony, setting, inference, and conflict. **Science (Mr. Pearson)** - We will continue with our metric system unit. Students will be learning how to measure mass, volume, and density.

@NMSTeamPennState) (Instagram pennstatenms) Please check the parent portal to see how your child is performing in classes. <u>ELA-</u> <u>Period 1, 2, 5 & 8</u> - we will continue our Holocaust Unit and work on text dependent analysis, dialogue quiz on Thursday <u>Period 7</u> - we will work on text dependent analysis, dialogue quiz on Thursday <u>SCIENCE</u>- This week the students will be designing and carrying out their own experiment and documenting it with a formal lab report. This is a major project assessment for the first quarter and the final product on schoology will be due on Wed. 10/24 at 4 pm.We will be using class time to complete this during this week. <u>MATH</u> - Periods 1,2,5 and 7 are starting a new unit on Ratio and Proportion. At this point, they should start bringing their calculators to class every day. Period 8 will have a quiz on Monday on Sections 3-1 - 3-4. Expect students to have homework in math almost every day, all year. Most students are demonstrating responsibility in this area, but others are earning zeros. <u>Reading-</u> Students will be working on character and plot development, symbolism and tone . There will be a quiz on Friday. <u>Social Studies</u>- We will have the Unit 1 test Oct 1st.

Team East Stroudsburg (8th) (Twitter <u>@NMSTeamESU</u>) Reading classes will continue with Manhunt/Chasing Lincoln's Killer. Map projects should be worked on daily. They are due two days after we finish reading the book. All book reports due by October 29. Students will begin to study the Middle colonies, our main focus will be upon the colony of Pennsylvania. We will relate the founding of Pennsylvania to later abolition and equality movements in history. Math 8 students are going to be finishing up Topic 1 by learning about scientific notation. Algebra 1 students are ready to move onto Topic 2, Linear Equations.

Team Northampton (8th) (Twitter @TeamSpartanNMS) - History classes will be finishing the New England Colonies and beginning on the Middle Colonies, focusing on the contributions of Penn, Franklin and the Moravians. Please be sure your child has headphones so they can work independently in class viewing the techbook videos as well as using the embedded reader tools Discovery offers. In ELA this week, Periods 1, 3, 5, and 8 have the brainstorms for their mysterious narrative accounts due on Monday. We will begin learning about characterization and begin creating our complex characters for our story. We will also continue to work on our pronoun uses and can expect a quiz on this topic late in the week. Period 7 has their final poem project due on Friday, Oct. 19. In Reading, we are continuing our nonfiction unit with Manhunt and Chasing Lincoln's Killer. Students all have their own copy of the novels and are expected to bring them to class every day. We will continue to work on citing text-based evidence and using our critical thinking skills. Students had 3 research days to work on their artifact project and should be ready to create and write. This is mostly an at-home project and is due on 10/24. Copies of the rubric are available on Schoology. Please continue to check your Schoology class for updates, announcements, assignments and any handouts used in ALL classes. In Algebra 1, students will be working with Linear Equations - writing and graphing all 3 forms. In Grade 8 Math, students will be solving equations. Students will continue to use both the IXL and Math XL programs. Please continue to check Schoology for all assignments, assessments and due dates. In Science, we will be reviewing for the Chapter Test. (States of Matter, Elements Compounds and Mixtures and Physical and Chemical Changes.) Please be sure your child is writing in his or her planner to stay on top of their course work. There is FREE HOMEWORK HELP at the Bethlehem Public Library with Moravian College and Lehigh University Students - take advantage of this!
