GoGuardian is set up to filter and monitor only during the hours of 7:30 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. and only on District Chromebooks.

English (Mr. Falteich) - This week marks the halfway point of the author study unit. Students will learn the 5 methods of fictional characterization and discuss how Saki applies them in the short story, "The Lumber Room." There will be a quiz on Thursday on all literary terms discussed during our reading of the first 4 Saki stories. Students will receive an outline to help them prepare for the quiz. Science (Mr. Pearson) - There will be a test on measuring distance, mass, volume, density, and converting between temperature scales on Thursday, November 1st.

Team Penn State (7th) **Follow us on social media!!** (Twitter @NMSPennState) (Facebook @NMSTeamPennState) (Instagram pennstatenms) **The quarter officially ends Oct. 31....all work for classes needs to be completed! <u>ELA</u>-Please continue to check grades and be proactive!! All work is due by this Wednesday, October 31st, which is the end of the marking period. We will be starting our narrative writing assignment this week and focusing on powerful introductions. In addition, the students will receive their new vocabulary lists on Monday. <u>SCIENCE</u>-Sciwordophilia- Creatures created using the Latin and Greek prefix/suffix/roots will be due on Wed. This week we will return to science court to get a working definition of all the qualities that living things possess. <u>MATH</u> - Periods 1,2,5 and 7 are starting a new unit on Ratio and Proportion. At this point, they should start bringing their calculators to class every day. Period 8 will have a quiz on Monday on Sections 3-1 - 3-4. Expect students to have homework in math almost every day, all year. Most students are demonstrating responsibility in this area, but others are earning zeros. <u>Reading-</u> We will finish the movie and write a comparison paper. Test this week for class 1,2,5 and 7. We will begin The Lottery in honor of the jackpots that I didn't win. <u>Social Studies</u>- We will have the 5 Themes of geography vocabulary test Monday 10/22. Our "create a place" project is due 10/30.**

Team East Stroudsburg (8th) (Twitter <u>@NMSTeamESU</u>) History classes will begin Unit 2, Colonial Living. This unit will focus on life in Colonial Bethlehem. Extra credit will be available by taking selfies with building that are over 200 years old. Reading classes will complete a Text Based Analysis on John Wilkes Booth's goals. Notebooks will be collected for a quarterly grade. All book reports are due Monday. Each day late results in a 10% reduction in grade.In ELA, we just finished our unit on pronouns! Now we will begin our Historical Fiction unit on "Of Mice and Men." Throughout this unit we will explore how history impacts setting and characters. We will also analyze how author's word choice affects mood and tone in-preparation for writing our own historical fiction narratives. We had to slow down a bit in math this week, and so this list will look familiar. Math 8 will be finishing up Lesson 1-10 and preparing for their Topic 1 Exam. Algebra will be finishing Slope-Intercept form and moving on to Lesson 2-2. Science: We will be exploring the periodic table and how to read it. We will have a quiz on atom drawing. They will also be playing periodic table Battleship.

History classes will be finishing their Colonial America Unit with the Southern Colonies - Unit Assessment to follow. In ELA this week, we will be working on creating the setting for our mysterious narrative accounts and will then move onto studying and developing the plot. We will also continue our work on our word crime, two independent clauses joined by a coordinating conjunction. In Reading, we are continuing our nonfiction unit with *Manhunt* and *Chasing* Lincoln's Killer. Students all have their own copy of the novels and are expected to bring them to class every day. There is a grade assigned for being responsible and bringing all materials to class. We will continue to work on citing text-based evidence and using our critical thinking skills. The artifact projects were awesome! Well done, Team Northampton! We are currently presenting our projects. Periods 1,5,7 will have a test on Prologue to Chapter 6 next week after presentations conclude. Please continue to check your Schoology class for updates, announcements, assignments and any handouts used in ALL classes. In Algebra 1, students will review for their Unit 2 Test. The Units 2 Test will be broken up into two days, Thursday and Monday. In Grade 8 Math, students will be working with slope and y-intercept, graphing linear equations in Slope Intercept Form and writing equations in Slope Intercept Form. Students will continue to use both the IXL and Math XL programs. Please continue to check Schoology for all assignments, assessments and due dates. In Science, we will be exploring the Periodic Table. Outline and Stations Lab will be due on Monday. Quiz will be on Thursday. Please be sure your child is writing in his or her planner to stay on top of their course work. There is FREE HOMEWORK HELP at the Bethlehem Public Library with Moravian College and Lehigh University Students - take advantage of this!
