**BASD Education Week (Mayes)** Please see the schedule posted online and sent home with your child last week. Each October, the Bethlehem Area School District celebrates our community's commitment to public education with our BASD American Education Week. We invite you to join us and visit your child's classrooms during their





classes on the following days. Each day, adult family members may join us by checking in at the Main Entrance with our volunteers. We require that you not bring younger siblings to classes, as the classrooms are small and classes are in session. Instead, consider sharing child care responsibilities with a neighbor or friend. Seating may not be available in classrooms due to their limited size. Parents are not permitted to join their child at lunch during the lunch period due to seating. Please talk with your child so they know you are coming in and what classes they have each period on the day scheduled. The offices will not be able to print schedules during this week.

**IPR Available Online (Mayes)** on Friday at 3 pm, your child's Interim Progress Report (IPR) is available online at the Home Access Center (<a href="https://www.beth.k12.pa.us/ParentsStudents/">https://www.beth.k12.pa.us/ParentsStudents/</a>) or through our eSchoolPLUSFamily app, available on your app store. Your district login & password will allow you to access this information, which was mailed to you in August and was used to complete your start-of-the-year paperwork online. IPR's are a mid-quarter check of your child's grades before your child completes the 1st Quarter on Wednesday, October 31, 2018. You should sit with your child this weekend and review their grades, now at the mid-quarter point. Paper copies of the IPR are not issued since they are available online. You will receive the quarterly report card on paper by US Mail. The 1st Quarter report card will reach you on or about Tuesday, November 13, 2018. Please make sure you completed the start-of-the-year paperwork on the Registration Gateway

(https://www.beth.k12.pa.us/ParentsStudents/) to make sure your mailing address, email, and phone numbers are correct. If you have a question about your child's grades, work with your child to email your child's teacher for more information. A great strategy is to have your child email his/her teacher & guidance counselor with your help and copying you on the email so everyone can stay in contact together AND encourage your child's self-advocacy skills. In addition, your child will also bring home the paper parent report for the 2018 administration of the PSSA Exams today. This message also has been sent to your child's BASD email account.

Munro. This week students will read a few of his short stories, analyze, and respond to the text. The stories to be read this week are "The Storyteller", "The Interlopers", and "Gabriel Ernest". Literary terms that will be discussed are satire, theme, conflict types, and characterization. Additionally, Vocabulary Lesson 5 definitions and sentences are due on Thursday, October 11. Science (Mr. Pearson) - We will continue with our metric system unit this coming week. Students will be learning how to measure mass and volume.

We will be conducting a simple experiment with m and m's (students who have not brought them yet need to come prepared on Thursday) and write a lab report for this experiment. MATH - Periods 1,2,5 and 7 have their first unit test on Friday. Period 8 is working on the second unit (Unit 3 in their books) which is on ratio and proportion. Expect students to have homework in math almost every day, all year. Most students are demonstrating responsibility in this area, but others are earning zeros. Reading-Students will be working on Text Dependent Analysis responses for inferences made in the novel. Social Studies-We will have the Unit 1 test Oct 1st.

**Team East Stroudsburg** (8th) (Twitter <u>@NMSTeamESU</u>) History class will be finishing the New England colonies, we will focus on the Salem Witch Trials and how they relate to our current fake news controversies. Students will be encouraged to analyze information presented in digital and social media. Reading classes will begin making maps to track the escape route and activities of John Wilkes Booth. All book reports are due October 29. Math 8 students will be finishing up their work with real numbers and start to learn about rules of exponents. Algebra 1 students will be testing on Chapter 1 and moving on to Chapter 2

Team Northampton (8th) (Twitter @TeamSpartanNMS) - We will be using the techbook this week to look at New England colonies and learn how religion allowed various colonies to form. In the next few weeks, we will be using Studio in the Discovery Techbook to create unique projects on the Middle or Southern colonies. Please be sure your child has headphones so they can work independently in class viewing the techbook videos as well as using the embedded reader tools Discovery offers. In ELA this week, our final project for "The Speckled Band" is due Tuesday, Oct. 9 for Period 1, and Periods 3, 5, and 8 are due on Wednesday, Oct. 10. In class, we will continue working on our pronoun uses and will start to brainstorm for our mystery writing unit. In Reading, we are continuing our nonfiction unit with *Manhunt* and *Chasing Lincoln's Killer*. Students all have their own copy of the novels and are expected to bring them to class every day. We will continue to work on citing text-based evidence and using our critical thinking skills. Students were assigned their Artifact Project which is an at-home project and is due on 10/24. Copies of the rubric are available on Schoology. Please continue to check your Schoology class for updates, announcements, assignments and any handouts used in class. In Algebra 1, students will take their Unit 1 Test on Wednesday and will start Unit 2 - Linear Equations. In Grade 8 Math, students will start Unit 2 - Analyze and Solve Linear Equations. Students will need to have headphones for Tuesday and will continue to use both the IXL and Math XL programs. Please continue to check Schoology for all assignments, assessments and due dates. In





Science, we will be reviewing for the Chapter Test. (States of Matter, Elements Compounds and Mixtures and Physical and Chemical Changes.) Please be sure your child is writing in his or her planner to stay on top of their course work.
