Academic Team Updates

Team Lafayette (6th) (Twitter <u>@NMSLafayette</u>) The 2nd Marking Period ends this Thursday. Please keep checking parent portal and your child's planner to make sure there are no missing assignments. Team Lafayette is currently planning a community service project to help local animal shelters. Please stay tuned for more details from the students!

Team Lehigh (6th) (Twitter <u>@NMSTeamLehigh</u>) This coming week marks the end of the 2nd marking period. We are officially halfway through the year!!! This means that our students are closer to 7th graders than they are to 5th and we hopefully are seeing behavior and responsibility habits that show such. Extra help is available Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday from 3:05- 3:40. **Science (Mr. Pearson)** - This week we will begin discussing the characteristics that all living things have in common.

Periods 7 & 8 have started a novel called <u>Notes from the Midnight Driver</u>. Science- Quiz on the chemical reactions of respiration and photosynthesis Thursday.. Reading- We will begin <u>Monster</u>, a novel by Walter Dean Myers. It is another courtroom drama. Math - Periods 8 is working on solving equations and will have a quiz Monday on two-step equations. Periods 1,2,5 and 7 are still simplifying expressions.. All classes will also be taking the Math Inventory test this week. Social Studies- We are learning about the United States history and culture.

IF there is a 2-hour delay or a school closing on Tuesday, the trip will be rescheduled. An update on Schoology and the student's email will be blasted out as soon as possible. History classes will be learning about what challenges the Continental Army faced, the various roles women, Native Americans, and African Americans played in the war, and the significant impact Europeans had in the victory of the Revolution. This past week, students selected their elective courses that tailor to the potential pathway of each student for their 9th grade year. Every student went home with their potential choices and the LHS elective sheet. PLEASE ask your child to share in this important step toward LHS next year. Reading classes just finished working on a poem about Paul Revere's midnight ride to align with history class. Students are learning about annotating poetry as well as how to answer text-dependent analysis questions. All students are learning about Civil Rights and reading poetry, short stories, and creating their own poem during this unit. Algebra 1 classes will be finishing Solving Systems of Linear Equations and Inequalities (Unit 4 Test Wednesday) and start Unit 5 - Graphing Absolute Value Functions. Math 8th students will take their Unit 4 Test on Monday (1/14) and continue working on Solving Systems of Linear Equations.. In ELA classes, we will finish our discussion of topic sentences and supporting details by writing and evaluating paragraphs. We will also move onto connecting sentences with verbal bridges. ALL classes have their interviews due on Friday, Jan. 25. In science we will be continuing Balanced vs Unbalanced forces.
