Reading (Mrs. Gomez) - In reading class, students in first period will continue to read the chapter of "December" in the novel, The Wednesday Wars. We will be studying and summarizing a new Shakespeare play this week. Second period students should start to prepare for a test on chapters 8-14 of the novel, Al Capone Does My Shirts. The test is scheduled for Friday, 2/8. Fifth and seventh period students will have a test on the entire novel The Outsiders on Friday, 2/8. Students should use all of their notes in order to prepare for the test. If students have questions, they should stay after school for extra help. Students in eighth period will be taking a test on pages 74-124 of the the novel, Notes From the Midnight Driver on Monday, 2/4. ELA (Mr. Falteich) - This week students will learn the proper uses of nominative and objective case pronouns. The students also have a special vocabulary sheet due on Thursday, 2/6. In anticipation of our next literature unit, 12 Angry Men, the vocabulary terms all deal with terminology that will be discussed during our dramatic reading of the play. There are no sentences due this week, but students should write more complete

definitions of the legal terms. **Science (Mr. Pearson)** - Due to the days off and delayed openings because of the snow, this week we will be discussing the chemical compounds that are essential for all living things.

Each homeroom will have a design group that holds the most pennies before sinking and a final winning group will be determined during the team competition. We will be watching the movie "Spare Parts" (rated PG-13)...a true story based on four high school students who enter a robotics competition against the nations top tech colleges. An unforgettable tale that shines with heart, humor, and hope. ELA - Periods 1, 2 & 5 will continue a poetry analysis unit. This week, we will focus on civil rights poetry. Reading- We are analyzing testimony and interpreting information to read. Students are jurors as they read Monster by Walter Dean Myers.

Math - Periods 8 will have a quiz Tuesday on two-step equation word problems and multi-step equations. Later in the week, they'll begin working with inequalities. Students will have a quiz on Friday. Periods 1,2,5 and 7 are finishing up the unit on simplifying expressions. Their Unit Test will be on Thursday. Social Studies- We are learning about the United States history and culture.

We will continue reading Soldier X and identifying themes in each chapter title. **ELA**: This week we be going over symbolism, motifs, and themes in Of Mice and Men. Students will have a quiz on those skills as well as the vocabulary from chapters 3 and 4 on February 13th. Social Studies classes will continue to learn about the Boston Tea Party and other events from the Pre American Revolution Unit.
