the National Constitution Center's Civil War and Reconstruction Exhibit - America's first exhibit devoted to exploring how constitutional clashes over slavery set the stage for the Civil War, and how the nation transformed the Constitution after the war to more fully embrace the Declaration of Independence's promise of liberty and equality. In Mrs. Hinkel's ELA class, we will finish our discussion on "The House on Mango Street" and begin introducing our poetry unit. Our noun use quizzes have been rescheduled for Feb. 18 and 19.
