Snow continues to plague the third marking period. We would like to thank everyone for showing up on time for their virtual sessions this past Thursday and Friday. For the most part, we thought they went fairly well. A couple of important reminders on this topic: 1) E-classroom students are expected to attend; 2) you should be accessing the session from your school computer and your proper name should be displayed during the session; and 3) if asked to show your face or speak, you should be prepared to do so.

With that being said, it appears that the inconsistent schedule due to the weather, has caused an increase in missing work. Detentions area being assigned to those students who are continuously behind with their assignments. Please go into schoology a minimum of once a week and look for missing assignments and/or assignments that need to be re-done. Keep in mind that you have to actually open the grade report to see these. Once an assignment is given a grade of any kind (zeros included) or is marked as missing/incomplete it will no longer show up on the right hand side as work to be done. That right hand column on the schoology page can be very misleading.

This is also true on a daily basis. Students should be opening their course each day and looking at the agenda to see what they have to do. Extra information and directions are in there that do not appear on the right hand side. In addition future assignments that students are not ready for yet, but are posted for the marking period are often on the right hand side. These are not intended to be completed until gone over by the teacher. Unfortunately, students are seeing these, doing them and failing as a result. Use the information within the course folders to see what must be completed each day.

Again as we have mentioned before, we are here both before (7:30 am) and after (til 3:30) school for students who need a place to come in and work. As of now no one has taken advantage of coming in before school. If you have trouble finding a quiet place to work at home or your internet is not all that stable, before school is an excellent solution to the problem.
