I'm so proud to let you know that the Franklin Covey organization who runs the Leader in Me program has recognized Spring Garden for **outstanding academic growth in 2025**! We are officially on their Academic Honor Roll. This is a prestigious award that we've never won before, and it's a big deal!



To be eligible, Lighthouse Schools like Spring Garden have to achieve growth of at least 5% from the prior year on our state testing performance. We not only hit that target, we flew by it with a 17% gain! Way to go, SG kids and teachers!

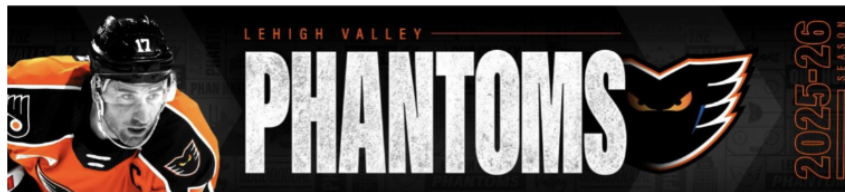

## Leader in Me Habit 5: Seek First to Understand

This habit is one that is a central part of my life. I find that listening deeply makes all the difference – whether I'm talking with kids, teachers, parents, or my own family. All humans want to be heard and understood. And when we know another person is taking the time and care to listen, then we are able to be open to what they have to share. Modeling this habit for our kids helps them express themselves more thoughtfully, and become collaborative problem-solvers. Here are the key points of Habit 5:

Empathetic Listening: **Truly hearing and feeling what others are saying, looking at them,** and understanding their feelings and viewpoints.

Balance of Courage & Consideration: **It takes kindness (consideration) to listen deeply** and courage to express your own thoughts clearly.

Non-Judgmental Approach: **Avoiding automatic replies** or filtering what's heard through your own "autobiography" (past experiences).

Clear Communication: **Once understood, voicing your ideas articulately and respectfully,** using "I" statements.
